## **Lindale C of E Primary School**

Lindale Primary School is a small, rural school near, Grange-Over-Sands. There are 54 pupils in the school (including Muddy Boots Nursery next door) so everyone knows everyone else's names. The pupils are split into four classrooms: reception (and nursery in the afternoon), years one and two, years three and four and years five and six.

## **Outside Areas**

Behind the school, they have the field which has the climbing frame, the gazebo, the oak tree, the willow huts, the rope and pulley system, the decking, the weighing scale and a path round the edge. The path now has markings which include: a run and jump section, two balance sections and a sprinting section. In Summer 2022, the school installed a gazebo at the bottom of the field; it is well made and has five comfy animal cushions (a parrot, a penguin, a hedgehog, a mouse and an insect). At the top of the field, is the oak tree which is a nice place to have a conversation with your peers. Also, there is a climbing frame situated at one side of the field. Its features are two bars (one high up and the other one is slightly lower), a netting wall to climb over and two tires.

## The Staff

All the teachers in Lindale School are kind and outstanding. There are eleven teachers and teaching assistants, Mrs Wood (the office manager) and Mrs Lishman who serves lunch. Mrs Law and Miss Barker teach Ks1, Mr Rodgers and Miss Snelson help them. Mrs Watson is the year three and four teacher but she teaches year five and six some lessons as well. Mrss Entwistle and Miss Seale help in Ks2 and Mrs Coulston and Miss Dickinson teach some lessons but they help out on the other days. Mrs Curwen is the year five and six teacher but is also the Headmistress however, she sometimes teaches year three and four. Specialist teachers come into school for example Madame Cook (for French), Dr Kelly (for occasional Science lessons), Mrs O'kane (for Computing, a term each year) and different P.E. coaches. One of the coaches has been in the past is Neil (for Cricket) and currently there is Jenny (for gymnastics).

## Clubs

During the year, there are different clubs. Currently there are: Young Voices on a Wednesday, where on the 1<sup>st</sup> February you get to go to Manchester to sing with lots of other schools; Wellbeing Club on a Thursday lunch-time, where you do yoga, mindful colouring and fun games; Gymnastics Club on a Monday, where you get to practice the skills you know and maybe learn some new ones; Fun Club on every school day, for if parents have to work late and there is no one to pick up a pupil they can go to Fun Club, and Judo on a Friday, where you learn how to defend yourself. Some of the clubs there has been in the past are Engineering Club, Computing Club, Multi Skills Club, Cricket Club, Secret Agent Club (where you learn about stories in the bible) and Craft Club.
