Year 1 and 2 have been loving their Forest Schools sessions with Furness Outdoors this half-term. Some of the children were excitedly telling me all about their days - it sounds like the hot chocolate and hammocks were a big hit! Mad Science

We welcomed Mad Science to school once again for Science Week. The children enjoyed some lively, fun sessions: Reception, 1 and 2 learnt about states of matter while making slime; year 3 and 4 experimented with paper aeroplanes to test aerodynamics and stability; and year 5 and 6 explored how machines make jobs easier while learning about levers, pulleys and forces.

The Yogi Group

The Yogi Group came for a day to do wellbeing sessions with all of our pupils. They learnt some breathing techniques and focused on having a positive mindset.
