Attendance and Punctuality

Good attendance and punctuality is important for a range of reasons. When children miss time out of school, it has an effect on both academic progress and social aspects. The doors open in the morning at 8.45am and close at 8.50am. Entry after this time should be through the main entrance. Children are marked late in the register if they arrive after 8.50am. This year, if your child is aged 5+ there will be more formal communication regarding attendance and lateness as needed. This will follow the attendance and lateness flowcharts on the last two pages of our policy (found on our website) https://www.lindale.cumbria.sch.uk/wp-content/uploads/2023/09/Attendance-Policy-and-Procedures.pdf Each of the classes have a morning routine between 8:45 and 9am which I've detailed below. If children are late, they miss out on this key time. For example, if a child is 10 minutes late each day, they miss 50 minutes a week out of key learning time. Starting from Monday 25th September, the adult admitting late children into school will ask the adult for the reason for being late and record this along with the time. Further action will be taken if needed following the flowchart above. For safety reasons, it's important that adults accompany their child into the main entrance if they are late as there is no adult supervision in the playground and the office is not always manned.

8:45 - 9am routines:

Early Years and KS1: Start the day with handwriting practice which is a vital time to develop this skill.

Year 3 and 4: Review and correct work from the day before and then complete comprehension quizzes on Read Theory.

Year 5 and 6: Complete comprehension quizzes on Read Theory and review and correct work from the day before.

Registration time is also often used as a time to listen to readers and change books.

VIP, Star of the Week and the Shine Tree

If your child comes home in a blue jumper/polo shirt, they are VIP for the week! They will have some special privileges in their classes and a VIP certificate. If your child is VIP, families are invited to a special assembly at 9am that Friday. If you need more notice for your child's VIP assembly, please talk to their class teacher who will try their best to accommodate this.

Each Friday, teachers hand out a Star of the Week who will receive a certificate and recognition in Friday's celebration assembly. Teachers also choose someone who has let their light shine for the Shine Tree. This can be for a variety of reasons e.g. being kind, helpful, a good role model, polite or sharing a talent. Chosen children will receive a 'candle' to hang on the Shine Tree and a sticker to take home.

Wednesdays

Just a reminder that Mrs Wood doesn't work Wednesdays and the admin email isn't checked. If you have an important message for school, please leave an answer machine message which are picked up throughout the day.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club runs from 7.45am. The children have a morning snack and enjoy time to play and socialise, usually outside weather permitting. We often find that Breakfast Club helps some children to settle into the school day. Contact Claire or Lucy at Lindale Muddy Boots Nursery (015395 32208) to book your child in.

Fun Club Bookings

Fun Club runs every day from the end of school until 5.30pm. If you would like your child to attend Fun Club, please book them in through the office. We always pick up phone messages and the admin email address is checked on a Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. On a Wednesday, please leave a phone message rather than an email. You can book your child into Fun Club in advance or on the day. If you are booking your child in later in the afternoon for that day, by phone is ideal. Earrings and PE

For safety reasons, earrings can't be exposed during PE lessons. If your child can remove their earrings themselves, they will be asked to do this. If earrings can't be removed, they will be covered for PE using microporous tape.

If you have a passion or skill that you would like to share with the children either during school time or as an after-school club, we would be really interested to hear about it. For example, in the past our pupils have enjoyed learning about bee keeping, listening to and playing the harp, and cooking.
